Seth Hayes is a member of the Black Panther Party and the Black Liberation Army. He dedicated his life to the betterment of his people, but was framed and convicted of murdering a NYC police officer in 1973, and charged with seven counts of attempted murder and one count of murder in the first degree. He has been repeatedly denied parole, not based on his record in prison but because of his political beliefs and work with the Black Panther Party. Seth has dire medical concerns that have been neglected by the state, but has stayed strong, continuing to do invaluable work in prison despite both medical and legal injustice. He has worked with the NAACP on multiple occasions, and has served as a pre-release advisor and AIDS counselor.

“There is much to do comrades. Much to accomplish and much new material to review, grasp and develop. We all must recommit and steel ourselves. Our work of recording, participating, and passing on this era of history now begins.”
